The practitioner privileged to direct moderate sedation is responsible for the safety and wellbeing of the patient, and will ensure that this policy is observed. In either elective or emergent procedures, if circumstances warrant deviation from this policy, the reason will be documented in the patient's medical record.

I. Moderate Sedation (Conscious Sedation)

Moderate sedation, also sometimes referred to as conscious sedation, is a drug-induced depression of consciousness. A patient who has been sedated in this way is relaxed and generally insensitive to pain, but remains awake and able to respond to verbal instruction.

Moderate Sedation/Analgesia (Conscious Sedation) a drug-induced depression of consciousness during which patients respond purposefully* to verbal commands, either alone or accompanied by light tactile stimulation. No interventions are required to maintain a patent airway, and spontaneous ventilation is adequate.

Moderate sedation produces a condition in which the patient exhibits a mildly depressed level of consciousness and an altered perception of pain but retains the ability to respond appropriately to verbal or tactile stimulation. The patient maintains protective reflexes and may experience some degree of amnesia. 1.

Moderate sedation (“conscious sedation”) ordered by the attending physician and administered by the surgeon or physician performing the procedure or an independent trained practitioner is considered medically necessary when alternative types of anesthesia, sedation, or analgesia are not appropriate.

In the "Practice Guidelines for Sedation and Analgesia by Non-anesthesiologists" of the ASA, it is recommended that preoperative oral intake restriction be implemented (level IV in level I).⁸ However, evidence on oral intake restriction for intravenous sedation during dental treatment is poor, and no conclusion has been reached.

Conscious sedation for clinical procedures. Overview. Sedation of patients during diagnostic and therapeutic procedures is used to reduce fear and anxiety, to control pain, and to minimise excessive movement. The choice of sedative drug will depend upon the intended procedure; some procedures are safer and more successful under anaesthesia.

As of 1995, safety considerations for conscious sedation include continuous monitoring of oxygen saturation, cardiac rate and rhythm, blood pressure, respiratory rate, and level of consciousness, as specified in national guidelines or standards.

Conscious Sedation/Moderate Sedation

Sedation and analgesia include a continuum of states of consciousness ranging from minimal sedation (anxiolysis) to general anesthesia. Shown below are the definitions of levels of sedation as defined and adopted by the American Society of Anesthesiologists (ASA). ASA Definitions of General Anesthesia and

performed with moderate sedation (formerly referred to as conscious sedation), the patient maintains ventilatory and cardiovascular function and is able to make purposeful responses to verbal or light tactile stimulation.^{2,5} In contrast, a patient undergoing deep sedation cannot be.
